### What does the fund invest in?

The fund invests primarily in units of mutual funds that invest in fixed income securities. The fund may have exposure to fixed-income securities rated below investment grade, with the allocation to these issues typically ranging between 5% and 15%.

### How risky is it?

The value of the fund can go down as well as up. You could lose money.

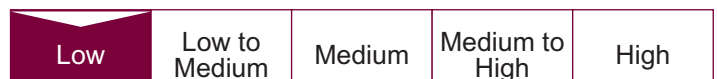
One way to gauge risk is to look at how much a fund's returns change over time. This is called "volatility".

In general, funds with higher volatility will have returns that change more over time. They typically have a greater chance of losing money and may have a greater chance of higher returns. Funds with lower volatility tend to have returns that change less over time. They typically have lower returns and may have a lower chance of losing money.

#### Risk rating

CIBC Asset Management Inc. has rated the volatility of this fund as **Low**.

This rating is based on how much the fund's returns have changed from year to year. It does not tell you how volatile the fund will be in the future. The rating can change over time. A fund with a low risk rating can still lose money.

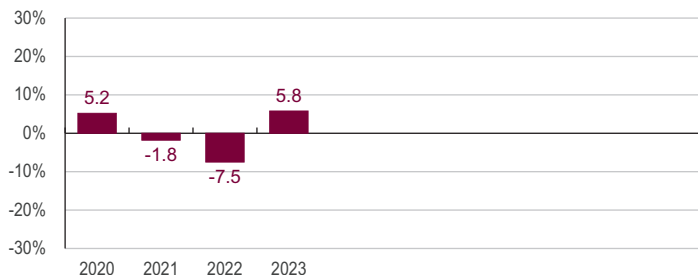
Like most mutual funds, this fund does not have any guarantees. You may not get back the amount of money you invest.

### How has the fund performed?

This section tells you how Series A units of the fund have performed over the past 4 years. Returns are after expenses have been deducted. These expenses reduce the fund's returns.

**YEAR-BY-YEAR RETURNS**

This chart shows how Series A units of the fund performed in each of the past 4 calendar years. Series A units dropped in value in 2 of the 4 years. The range of returns and change from year to year can help you assess how risky the fund has been in the past. It does not tell you how the fund will perform in the future.



**BEST AND WORST 3-MONTH RETURNS**

This table shows the best and worst returns for Series A units of the fund in a 3-month period over the past 4 calendar years. The best and worst 3-month returns could be higher or lower in the future. Consider how much of a loss you could afford to take in a short period of time.

**AVERAGE RETURN**

The annual compounded return of Series A units of the fund since October 28, 2019 was 0.5%. If you had invested \$1,000 in the fund on October 28, 2019, your investment would be worth \$1,024 as at June 30, 2024.

**Who is this fund for?**

**Investors who:**

- want to invest in a diversified portfolio of fixed income securities;
- seek regular income; and
- are investing for the medium to long term.

**A word about tax**

In general, you will have to pay income tax on any money you make on a fund. How much you pay depends on the tax laws where you live and whether or not you hold the fund in a registered plan such as a Registered Retirement Savings Plan (RRSP) or a Tax-Free Savings Account (TFSA).

Keep in mind that if you hold your fund in a non-registered plan, fund distributions are included in your taxable income, whether you receive them in cash or have them reinvested.

**How much does it cost?**

The following tables show the fees and expenses you could pay to buy, own, and sell Series A units of the fund. The fees and expenses - including any commissions - can vary among series of a fund and among funds. Higher commissions can influence representatives to recommend one investment over another. Ask about other funds and investments that may be suitable for you at a lower cost.

**1. SALES CHARGES**

There is an initial sales charge when you buy units of the fund.

**2. FUND EXPENSES**

You don't pay these expenses directly. They affect you because they reduce the fund's returns.

As at February 29, 2024, the expenses for Series A units of the fund were 0.95% of its value. This equals \$9.50 for every \$1,000 invested.

<b>Management expense ratio (MER)</b> This is the total of the fund's management fee (including the trailing commission), fixed administration fee, and any operating expenses not covered by the fixed administration fee (fund costs) for Series A units of the fund. CIBC Asset Management Inc. waived or absorbed some of the fund's expenses. If it had not done so, the MER would have been higher.	0.94%

**More about the trailing commission**

The trailing commission is an ongoing commission. It is paid for as long as you own the fund. It is for the services and advice that your representative and their firm provide to you.

CIBC Asset Management Inc. pays the trailing commission to your representative's firm. It is paid from the fund's management fee and is based on the value of your investment.

For Series A units, a trailing commission of 0% to 0.50% of the value of your investment each year (\$0.00 to \$5.00 each year on every \$1,000 invested) is paid from the management fee.

**3. OTHER FEES**

You may have to pay other fees when you buy, hold, sell, switch, or convert units of the fund.

Fee	What you pay
<b>Short-term trading fee</b>	Up to 2% of the value of units you sell or switch within 30 days of buying them. This fee goes to the fund.
<b>Switch fee</b>	If you sell units of the fund to buy units of another fund managed by us or our affiliates, you may pay a switch fee of up to 2% of the value of units you switch. This fee goes to your representative's firm.
<b>Conversion fee</b>	If you convert units of the fund to another series of units of the same fund, you may pay a conversion fee of up to 2% of the value of units you convert. This fee goes to your representative's firm.

**What if I change my mind?**

Under securities law in some provinces and territories, you have the right to:

- withdraw from an agreement to buy mutual funds within two business days after you receive a simplified prospectus or Fund Facts document, or
- cancel your purchase within 48 hours after you receive confirmation of the purchase.

In some provinces and territories, you also have the right to cancel a purchase, or in some jurisdictions, claim damages, if the simplified prospectus, Fund Facts document, or financial statements contain a misrepresentation. You must act within the time limit set by the securities law in your province or territory.
