What does the fund invest in?

The fund invests primarily in Canadian equity securities that produce dividend income. Investment in securities of foreign issuers is not generally expected to exceed 30% of the net asset value of the fund.

How risky is it?

The value of the fund can go down as well as up. You could lose money.

One way to gauge risk is to look at how much a fund's returns change over time. This is called "volatility".

In general, funds with higher volatility will have returns that change more over time. They typically have a greater chance of losing money and may have a greater chance of higher returns. Funds with lower volatility tend to have returns that change less over time. They typically have lower returns and may have a lower chance of losing money.

Risk rating

CIBC Asset Management Inc. has rated the volatility of this fund as **Medium**.

This rating is based on how much the fund's returns have changed from year to year. It does not tell you how volatile the fund will be in the future. The rating can change over time. A fund with a low risk rating can still lose money.

No guarantees

How has the fund performed?

Who is this fund for?	A word about tax
 Investors who: seek Canadian equity exposure; are looking for dividend income with potential for capital appreciation; and are investing for the long term. 	In general, you will have to pay income tax on any money you make on a fund. How much you pay depends on the tax laws where you live and whether or not you hold the fund in a registered plan such as a Registered Retirement Savings Plan (RRSP) or a Tax-Free Savings Account (TFSA). Keep in mind that if you hold your fund in a non-registered plan, fund distributions are included in your taxable income, whether you receive them in cash or have them reinvested.

How much does it cost?

The following tables show the fees and expenses you could pay to buy, own, and sell Series FT6 units of the fund. The fees and expenses - including any commissions - can vary among series of a fund and among funds. Higher commissions can influence representatives to recommend one investment over another. Ask about other funds and investments that may be suitable for you at a lower cost.

1. SALES CHARGES

There are no sales charges payable when you buy, switch, or sell Series FT6 units of the fund.

2. FUND EXPENSES

You don't pay these expenses directly. They affect you because they reduce the fund's returns.

The fund's expenses are made up of the management fee, fixed administration fee, any operating expenses not covered by the fixed administration fee (fund costs), and trading costs. The Series FT6 annual management fee is 0.20% and the fixed administration fee is 0.05% of the series' value. Because this series is new, the fund costs and trading costs are not yet available.

More about the trailing commission

No trailing commission is paid in respect of Series FT6 units.

3. OTHER FEES

You may have to pay other fees when you buy, hold, sell, switch, or convert units of the fund.

Fee	What you pay
Fee-based arrangements	You can buy Series FT6 units through representative firms who have entered into a Series FT6 agreement with CIBC Asset Management Inc. and who participate in investment programs such as fee-for-service or wrap accounts. Instead of paying a sales charge, investors purchasing Series FT6 units may pay fees to their representative firm for their services.
Short-term trading fee	Up to 2% of the value of units you sell or switch within 30 days of buying them. This fee goes to the fund.
Switch fee	If you sell units of the fund to buy units of another fund managed by us or our affiliates, you may pay a switch fee of up to 2% of the value of units you switch. This fee goes to your representative's firm.
Conversion fee	If you convert units of the fund to another series of units of the same fund, you may pay a conversion fee of up to 2% of the value of units you convert. This fee goes to your representative's firm.

What if I change my mind?	For more information
 Under securities law in some provinces and territories, you have the right to: withdraw from an agreement to buy mutual funds within two business days after you receive a simplified prospectus or Fund Facts document, or cancel your purchase within 48 hours after you receive confirmation of the purchase. In some provinces and territories, you also have the right to cancel a purchase, or in some jurisdictions, claim damages, if the simplified prospectus, Fund Facts document, or financial statements contain a misrepresentation.
